Submitting Papers

Submitted papers must be in English, should be typed in a single column, single-spaced format, Font to be Times New Roman, all major headings to be 12 point and body of text 10 point. Papers must adhere to the maximum word limit of 3500 words and must include a 200 word abstract and keywords identifying the paper's area. **Papers must be submitted prior to 30 September 2011.**
